Connie L. Grazier passed away at age 85 on September 5, 2019 after a short illness. Connie was born July 28, 1934 in Centre County, PA to John and Virginia (Woomer) Musser. She graduated from beauticians' school and married Donald 'Don' E. Grazier on September 8, 1956. They resided several years in California before returning to Millheim, PA where Connie was a hair stylist, school bus driver with the Penns Valley Area High School system, and a volunteer EMT with the Millheim Fire and Rescue Department.
